Wait Actively

"I believe that I shall see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living. Wait for the Lord; be strong, and let your heart take courage; wait for the Lord!"



— Psalm 27:13-14, NRSV; (Taizé chant partially based on this Scripture: https://youtu.be/s7GexIvX8HU)

We live in an impatient age. The conveniences afforded to us by technology—whether it be on-demand home deliveries or hailing a ride with a few taps on our smartphones—seemingly threaten to atrophy our ability to wait.

I suspect, however, that we have been as impatient as we have always been. We are no better and no worse at managing the uncertainty of waiting. Rather, it is the posture of our waiting that we must change: we must learn to wait actively, not passively.

When we wait passively, we not only expect instant gratification, but also 100% satisfaction. It is true that technology has made that possible in so many areas of our lives. But it has warped our expectations in so many other ways. Technology by itself cannot create the lives we believe we deserve. It will not mend the relationships we want to heal. We will ultimately be disappointed if we expect to wait passively and expect miracles to come to us.

Waiting actively is infinitely harder. It demands that we "be strong, and let [our] heart[s] take courage." It requires daily cultivation of healthy habits. What we desire may not even turn out to be the result that happens, no matter how much effort and time we invest. But when the Lord comes, so to speak, a posture of active waiting will allow us to respond appropriately.

When I reread the Psalm quoted above, I was struck as never before by the psalmist's conviction that the goodness of God is already with us, even when we may not see it yet. Even if we cannot know what is to come, our waiting will not preclude the kin-dom of God being formed here on Earth.

All we must do is to take courage and be strong.

Associate Minister Rev. Kit to Take Sabbatical in 2020

Early next year, I'll be celebrating five years as one of your ministers here at First Church, which is both hard to believe, and yet, we have shared so much life together! My role has shifted considerably since I joined the staff in 2015, and this fall we officially updated my job title to more accurately reflect this evolution, from Young Adult Minister to the more expansive Associate Minister (although young adult ministry is still one of my primary arenas).

I am grateful to be eligible for my first ever sabbatical, which I plan to take in two parts, in hopes that my time away would be easier on the congregation and staff, and allow me to be present for Lent and Holy Week. Part one is coming right up in January and February (Jan. 2–Mar. 2, 2020). Then, I will likely take part two in June and July (both parts will include some study leave/vacation as well).

I'm excited about the creative space and spiritual rejuvenation this time will allow. While our church doesn't require a dedicated project or proposal from pastors on sabbatical, my goals include rest and replenishment, spiritual discipline, artistic expression, time to dedicate to relationships, and travel (Arizona, So. Cal, Hawaii, and Austin in Feb; summer travel TBD).

My roles and responsibilities here at First Church will be covered collaboratively by other staff and congregation members, guest preachers, and some intentional sabbatical coverage by church members and UCC ministers Rev. Sheryl Johnson and Member-in-Discernment the-almost-Rev. Kelly Colwell. Sheryl will expand her role of Open Chapel Coordinator to include Young Adult Ministry duties in my absence, and both Sheryl and Kelly will offer additional pastoral care support and occasional office hours.

My hope is that I'll return after each leg of this sabbatical with fresh energy, ideas, and eyes, ready to continue to bring my whole self to our shared ministry from a deep and sustainable wellspring. Thank you for offering this meaningful gift to your pastoral staff.

Want to Join a First Church Ministry?

The **Committee of Involvement** is considering members for various church leadership positions. Every member is welcome to let the committee know of their interest in any position, in particular, interest in serving on any of our **six core ministries**; **terms are typically two years**.

All ministries usually meet after church on the first Sunday of the month (in December SF& A will be meeting on December 8). Visit a ministry meeting to see what might be a good fit for you. Free childcare is provided.

More about the Ministries...

Adult Education - is responsible for providing ongoing education for adults that reflects congregational needs and interests in understanding Christ's teachings and applying them to all aspects of life: family and personal relationships, physical and mental health, spiritual growth, and social justice.

Care, Fellowship & Invitation (CF&I) - promotes fellowship and hospitality to the church family. CF&I strives to provide the means by which all may be drawn to experience and understand God's love through fellowship and an extended hand.

Families, Children & Youth (FamChY) - is devoted to nurturing and supporting the faith formation of children, youth and the adults who love them as they embark on a spiritual journey over a lifetime. Inclusivity, spiritual activism/social justice, support for parents and other caregivers as they guide their children's wellbeing and development, engaging children and youth in inspired worship, and providing opportunities for intergenerational connection all are core aspects of FamChY's work.

Justice & Service - promotes and is responsible for activities, projects, and education related to homeland and world ministries, local outreach, Christian social issues, and ecumenical organizations.

Stewardship, Finance & Administration (SF&A) - promotes the responsible stewardship of the church's physical plant, property, and finances in support of the church and its missions. It also has responsibility for emergency planning and preparedness. The Treasurer and Business Manager are standing members.

Worship & Spiritual Life (Deacons) - assists in developing and maintaining the Church's openness to God's spirit by planning and directing the formal and informal worship life of the Congregation, to include Church services and the sacraments. The Ministry shall also be responsible for the operation, appointments, and use of the sanctuary and chapel, spiritual well-being of the membership, assisting the Ministers in the spiritual care of the Congregation, and supporting those preparing for the ministry.

Elections will be held at the Annual Meeting February 2, 2020.

Among other positions elected by the congregation are Moderator-Elect, Council At-Large, Long Range Planning, Delegates, Committee of Involvement.
